

## Orton Wistow Primary School – Remote Learning Plan

In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and self-isolation, Orton Wistow Primary School has developed the following plan.

This plan takes into account the following instances:

1. An individual is self-isolating because of a positive test within the household;
2. A group of children are self-isolating because of a case of coronavirus in the bubble;
3. A whole bubble or cohort is self-isolating because of an outbreak of coronavirus

The plan complies with the expectations and principles outlined in the DFE document [Guidance for Full Opening of Schools](#).

### Software and Online Platforms





Teachers will make use of software and online platforms to provide the best possible home learning lessons and activities. During the lockdown last academic year, Years Five and Six successfully set up and used **Google Classroom** to deliver the vast majority of their home learning.

We will now use Google Classroom for **Key Stage Two (Years Three to Six)**. The children have been shown in school how to access their classrooms and guidance for parents will be sent home.

**FS and Key Stage One (Years One and Two)** will have a dedicated space on the school website for their home learning resources.

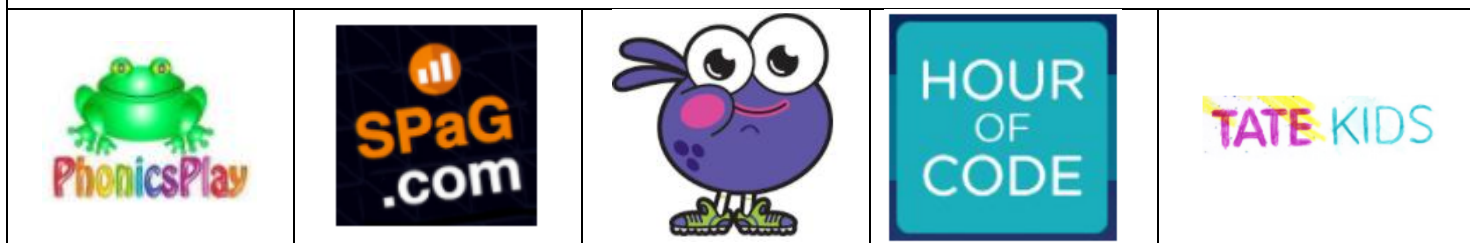
We will also continue to use other online software and resources whilst children are learning from home, including:



<p><b>Purple Mash</b></p> 	<p>Purple Mash is the creative online space from 2Simple. Purple Mash hosts an exciting mash-up of curriculum focused activities, creative tools, programs and games to support and inspire creative learning every day.</p> <p>All children have login details for this site. It can be accessed at any time and children will be able to see any work assigned to them by their teacher. <p><b>Times Table Rock Stars</b></p> 	<p>Times Tables Rock Stars is a carefully sequenced programme of daily times tables practice. Used from Year 2 onwards, it is a fun and interactive way for children to improve their times table knowledge.</p> <p>There is a link on the school website's Digital Village page and all the children who have accounts have been provided with their login details.</p> <p><a href="http://www.trockstars.com">www.trockstars.com</a></p>
<p><b>White Rose Maths</b></p> 	<p>At each key stage, the White Rose Maths curriculum covers the whole of the content of the 2014 National Curriculum. The scheme of learning is designed to support the development of reasoning and problem solving alongside fluency to ensure challenge and ambition for all pupils.</p> <p>There is a link for this on the school website's Digital Village page. Teachers will provide details of which resource the children need to access during any home learning days.</p> <p><a href="http://www.whiterosemaths.com">www.whiterosemaths.com</a></p>
<p><b>Oak Academy</b></p> 	<p>Oak Academy provides hour long lessons for all primary school year groups and can be accessed by all schools. Lessons often contain a video of a teacher leading the lesson and then links to the resources and work the children need to complete.</p> <p>Teachers will provide details of which lessons are to be completed whilst children are learning at home.</p> <p><a href="http://www.thenational.academy">www.thenational.academy</a></p>

Within all plans, teachers will set appropriate work in-line with our current curriculum, primarily supplemented by a range of resources provided by the online resources listed above.

Twitter will still be used to communicate with families. Parents and carers can still choose to tweet us with examples of home learning if they wish.

### What should parents do?

In the event of any form of isolation and loss of learning caused by coronavirus, parents must understand that engagement in home learning is **compulsory**, as is the expectation that Orton Wistow Primary School makes that provision available and accessible to all. However, if children themselves are too ill to attend then they should not be expected to engage in home learning.

In preparation for home-learning, parents and children need to know logins and passwords for the following platforms (likewise teaching staff need to be familiar with them):

- Purple Mash
- Google Classroom (Years 3-6)
- TT Rockstars (Years 2-6)
- Spag.com (Year 6)

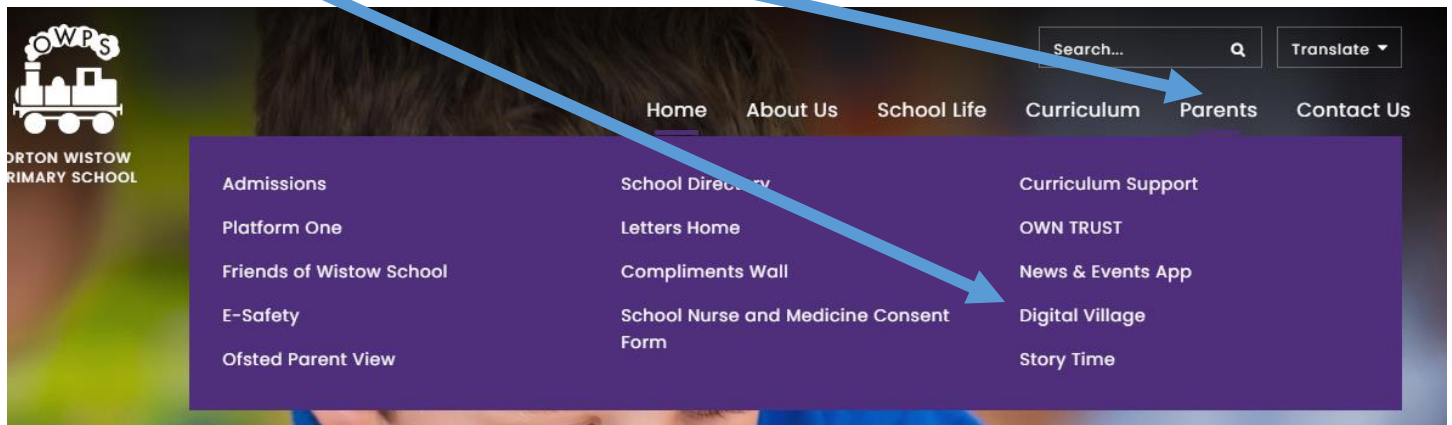
### Provision Summary

<p>On the school website there will be an area for children (and parents) to access.</p> <p>On the 'Digital Village' page you will now find three links at the top. (see screenshots below)</p> <p>The first link will take you to the correct section if your child is having to self-isolate individually or as part of a group.</p> <p>Once clicked, you will then see a choice of year group buttons.</p> <p>Select the year group your child is in and this will take you to another page where you will find two weeks of lessons/activities for English, Maths and Foundation subjects created by the teachers in that year group.</p>	<p><b>Foundation Stage and Key Stage One</b></p> <p>If your child is isolating because their class or year group bubble have been told to self-isolate, you will need to head to the Digital Village page on the school website. The second, third and fourth links at the top of this page will take you to a page for Foundation Stage, Year One or Year Two respectively.</p> <p>The lessons/activities uploaded to this area of the website will be dated and your child will need to do them in the correct order.</p> <p><b>Key Stage Two</b></p> <p>Every child in Years Three to Six has a Google account and are set up ready to use Google Classroom for their home learning.</p> <p>There are separate instructions on how to use Google Classroom being sent home and the guides will also be uploaded to the Digital Village page on the school website.</p> <p>Your child's class teacher will set work to be completed each day using Google Classroom.</p>

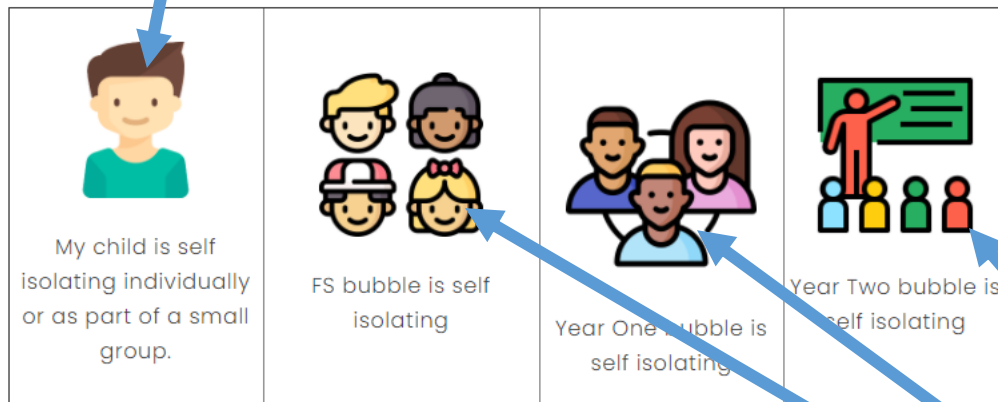


**My child is isolating individually or as part of a small group.** Please click on this icon.
