Year Group: 3 Topic Title: The Tudors



Subject	Learning
English - Reading	This term, in our focused reading lessons, we will explore the following texts: • The Butterfly Lion, by Michael Morpurgo • The Prince, The Cook and The Cunning King, by Terry Deary. • A Bear Called Paddington, by Michael Bond.
English - Writing	In our English lesson we will start the term by focussing on a non-fiction piece of writing on our previous geography topic. Later in the half the term, we will focus on non-fiction writing by writing biographies of famous people from Tudor England. We will then be writing narrative pieces based on the short film 'Something Fishy' and will finish the term by reading Robert Macfarlane's 'The Lost Words' and using these poems as writing inspiration. Throughout these lessons we will learn the following writing skills, which children will be expected to demonstrate in their writing: • Writing for a specific purpose and audience. • Organise writing into paragraphs and sections, with the use of headings and subheadings. • Use sentence demarcation with accuracy including full stops, capital letters, commas, question marks and exclamation marks. • Using fronted adverbials to change sentence openers avoiding repetition.
Mathematics	Our Maths curriculum will continue to follow the White Rose Maths scheme of work. We will work though the following units. • Fractions (part 2) • Money • Shape • Statistics • Time We will also continue to learn times tables facts, following the Number Sense programme. This term, in addition to revising times tables learnt in previous terms, we will focus on the 3 times table.
Science	During the summer term in Science we will be learning all about plants. We will focus on the different parts of a plant and their functions. We will be completing some practical investigations, looking specifically at how the stem of a plant works, and the best conditions in which a plant can grow and stay healthy. We will then apply this learning to research into the importance of plants in the world.
Computing	In Computing we will be using the Lego We Do kits in our Computer Science lessons, applying the computational thinking skills we have developed from the previous terms. In the second half term we will be learning how to use presentation software such as Google Slides to make presentations linked to our work in other curriculum areas.

Subject	Learning
	During the summer term we will be looking at the Tudors. We will be delving deeper, by focusing on six main questions: • What can we tell about Henry VIII from his portraits?
History	 Why did Henry break with Rome: love or religion? How different was life for people at different levels of society living in Tudor times, and how do we know?
	 Why do we have to be so careful when using the portraits of Elizabeth I to find out about her? How was Elizabeth able to defeat the mighty Spanish Armada? What can we learn about Elizabethan England by studying how they enjoyed their
	leisure time.
Geography	In Geography the focus will be all about the United Kingdom. We will be learning some key facts such as the names and locations of different cities, rivers and other landmarks as well as learning about the impact of migration on Britain. We will also be using our local area to learn more about Peterborough and the Fens.
	In DT, we will be using our textiles skills to create Tudor Rose mini cushions. These will be decorated with our own designs, using skills of embroidery and applique.
	In Art, we will focus on a new topic on Cloth, Thread, Paint. Throughout the lessons, the children will:

Music	This term, we will focus on Disco music. We will listen to a range of disco tracks, and identify the features of this genre of music. Children will learn about the musical elements of pulse, rhythm, structure and texture.
