Topic Title: The Stone Age

Subject	Learning
English - Reading	We will be focussing on developing our retieval and inference skills in our Reading lessons by studying the below texts.
English – Class Texts	In our Reading sessions we will be reading Stone Girl, Bone Girl by Laurence Anholt Josephine Baker from the Little People, Big Dreams Series Mouse, Bird, Snake, Wolf by David Almond Leopards Promise In our English lessons we will be reading Here We Are by Oliver Jeffers Ug by Raymond Briggs Werewolf Rules by Joseph Coehlo The Polar Express by Chris Van Allsburg
English - Writing	In our writing lessons we will be using the above texts as inspiration for our writing, as well as the short film 'Taking Flight' and also writing non-chronological reports based on the Stone Age. We will be focussing on using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause (and place) as well as using sentence punctuation accurately and starting to include paragraphs in our writing.
English – Phonics/Spelling	 Our Spelling, Grammar punctuation lessons this term will focus on learning to . spell further homophones place the possessive apostrophe accurately in words with regular plurals and in words with irregular plurals extending the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including when, if, because, although form nouns using prefixes (super-, anti-) spell word families based on common words (solve, solution, dissolve, insoluble) use the correct form of 'a' or 'an'
Mathematics	Our topics in Maths this terms will be Place Value Addition and Subtraction Multipication and Division We will also be concentrating on developing our knowledge of the 3 and 4 times tables.
Science	Our Science Topics this term are Rocks Animals including Humans
Computing	Our computing learning this term will focus on coding where we will be creating different simulations and exploring how to use timers.

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	Our History topic this term is The Stone Age. By the end of the topic children should
History	 Know that the earliest settlers were hunter-gatherers and lived in caves. Know that hunter-gatherers were living alongside early farmers about 5,000 years ago. Know that discovery of the settlement of Skara Brae was quite recent and that changed our view of early communities about 10,000 years ago. Know that Stonehenge was built about 5,000 years ago, in stages during the Bronze Age. Know characteristics of life in an Iron Age hill fort community.
	Our Gepgraphy learning wil focus on using maps. By the end of the topic we will
Geography	 Know the purpose of a sketch map. Know the purpose of symbols and a key on a map. Know the features of a sketch map: scale, symbols, aerial view. Know the important landmarks in the local area. Know different types of rural spaces: farming, housing, recreation and leisure, education, business and factories. Know that there are three different types of agriculture, the growing of crops and livestock farming. Arable: Crops. Pastoral: Animals. Mixed: Crops and animals.
	In our Art lessons we will be looking at Stone Age cave paintings, as well the work of
Art & Design	Barbara Hepworth and Pablo Picasso. We will build up to creating pastel drawing inspired by Stonehenge using hot and cold colours.
Music	In our Music lessons we will learning to sing and perform a R and B song called 'Let Your Spirit Fly.'
Design Technololgy	Our DT lessons will focus on using levers and pulleys to make products.
PE	In the first half term our PE sessions will be based on multi-skills and dance and after half term we will be doing golf and football.
RE	In our RE learning this term we will be learning about the Christian faith.

PSHE and RS	We will explore the themes of health in the first half term and bullying in the second half term. In our RSE lessons we will be My Feelings in the first half term and My Body in the second term.
	E-Safety will have two afternoons to cover different topics:
Online-Safety	Lesson 1 Rings of Responsibility - Pupils and students explore what it means to be responsible to and respectful of their offline and online communities as a way to learn how to be good digital citizens.
	Lesson 2 Password Power Up - How can you protect yourself from online identity theft? Pupils and students think critically about how and why to make stronger passwords.

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
