determiner - in grammar, a word, such as "a," "that," and "many," that in languages such as English often occurs before a noun or noun phrase and limits its range of

pronoun - a word that can take the place of a noun or noun phrase.

application. (To determine)

possessive pronoun -Possessive pronouns are words that take the place of nouns and show ownership.

adverbial - of, relating to, or functioning as an adverb. An adverbial clause at the beginning of a sentence is generally set off by a comma.

• spell further homophones

Learning

- spell words that are often misspelt (Appendix 1)
- use further prefixes and suffixes and understand how to add them
- how to place the possessive apostrophe accurately in words with regular plurals and in words with irregular plurals
- use the first 2 or 3 letters of a word to check its spelling in a dictionary
- in narratives, creating settings, characters and plot
- in non-narrative material, using simple organisational devices
- using commas after fronted adverbials
- indicating possession by using the possessive apostrophe with singular and plural nouns

- extending the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including when, if, because, although
- choosing nouns or pronouns appropriately for clarity and cohesion and to avoid repetition
- discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write in order to understand and learn from its structure, vocabulary and grammar
- assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing and suggesting improvements
- using fronted adverbials
- difference between plural and possessive -s
- Standard English verb inflections (I did vs I done)
- extended noun phrases, including with prepositions
- appropriate choice of pronoun or noun to create cohesion

What children will be able to do

- write from memory simple sentences, dictated by the teacher, that include words and punctuation taught so far.
- use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters and understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left un-joined
- increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting
- discussing and recording ideas
- read their own writing aloud, to a group or the whole class, using appropriate intonation and controlling the tone and volume so that the meaning is clear
- composing and rehearsing sentences orally (including dialogue), progressively building a varied and rich vocabulary and an increasing range of sentence structures
- organising paragraphs around a theme
- proposing changes to grammar and vocabulary to improve consistency, including the accurate use of pronouns in sentences
- proofread for spelling and punctuation errors
