
Our Quizmaster for the evening will be our very own Mrs Ironside, who we know will make it fun for all!



The challenge runs from 25th March to 5th April 2019.

It's free to enter and we would love everyone to be involved.



The details

On each day of the challenge schools compete to see who can record the greatest number of pupils, staff and parents walking, cycling or scooting to school. Our best 5 days will determine our final position in the challenge. We'll be competing against other schools right across the UK, and if we clock up the most bike and scooter journeys we'll win!

The format will be the same as last year with a great new addition to the criteria!

WALKING TO SCHOOL WILL COUNT TOO!

With so many of you living walking distance to school we are hoping to have more children, parents and carers joining in. In previous years we have had children say their parents don't have time to get bikes out of sheds as they normally walk to school. Although we encourage cycling we are really pleased we are able to count walking this year too!

There will be spot prizes during the fortnight for children who travel to school sustainably. If you live a distance from school and as a family you have chosen to leave the car behind and travel to school by bike or scooter, we would love to see a photograph, please email Ms Porter at lporter@owps.org.uk.

If you do need to drive to school maybe you could park further afield (Orton Northgate) so your child can still take part in this important event. The children are asked every day how they travelled to school. They enjoy sharing with their class that they travelled by bike or scooter!

Why we're taking part

It's a great way to get more of our pupils travelling to school on their bikes and scooters. We will be competing to become one of the UK's top schools for two-wheeled journeys and will be in with a chance to win prizes including bike and scooter stunt shows and fantastic cycle and scooter storage.

What's next?

All you need to do is encourage your child(ren) to cycle, walk or scoot to school every day during the event, and join them on their way – parent and sibling journeys count too! Last year we had parents who borrowed scooters to travel to school with their children! Well done!
