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
### National Coding Week

Last week we celebrated National Coding Week in school. Each class devoted a number of lessons to working on their programming skills. From creating algorithms to design a crazy character in Year 1, programming physical simulations using Purple Mash in Year 3 to applying their Computational Thinking Skills in Year 6; it was a skilful week of Computer Science for OWPS.










Classes also enjoyed a range of texts in their whole class reading time this week, designed in particular to highlight the successes of females in the field.

We heard about the historical achievements of Ada Lovelace and Grace Hopper and explored the technological careers available today through the text 'Blue Broccoli and Nanobots'.





Alongside work in classrooms, we also welcomed volunteers from Barclays who ran taster coding sessions with some children across KS2. They used Scratch to use code to make music, forming some great rock bands. The children who attended the sessions demonstrated a superb attitude and were commended by the volunteers for their perseverance skills.






As always, the children were a credit to the school and behaved exceptionally well throughout the three-day trip, (the adults even managed some sleep!)

### Reading

We have been delighted that many children have risen to the challenge of reading with an adult at home 5 times a week. Each score is turned into a Dojo point and this helps the class achieve their Class Reward.

Points mean prizes!



We are now tracking reading much more closely and know which children are not reading regularly at home. We were surprised to see that 39 children had either not read with an adult <u>at all</u>, or did not have their reading diary at school. We expect every child to have their reading book and reading diary in school every day, and many children will need the help of their parents to make sure this happens.

As we have now been back for three weeks, we will begin to flag up with parents if their child is not reading with an adult at home. This is our minimum expectation and many children in school are doing more than this. There is also a close link between how well children read and how often they read with an adult at home.
