

Eco 2019/2020

My assembly last week introduced the children to this year's Eco focus. Part of our Eco code is 'Eat healthily.' This is a great opportunity to build on the success of last year where we focussed on reducing plastic waste in school. Thank you so much to all the parents who now send their child into school with a healthy snack in a reusable pot rather than in plastic packaging.

I showed the children how too much sugar is harmful to our bodies; we want to avoid tooth decay and have a healthy heart! We then looked at how much added sugar there is in drinks and snacks. The children were surprised how much sugar there is in seemingly healthy snacks such as children's yogurts and drinks.



After recognising that some cereal bars have the equivalent of 4 teaspoons of sugar in them, a few children then tried a healthy alternative of raw vegetables dipped in hummus! We were very impressed that they were happy to try new foods. Do you know it takes 9 times of trying something to decide whether you like it or not!



Moving forward, over the coming year we are hoping to organise a child and parent consultation to look into how to make food in school more healthy. This will be looking into snacks in school, packed lunches and our school meals. We have already started this in the kitchen with less sugar being added to our dessert menu.

We would really like your support in promoting our 'Eat healthily' part of our Eco code and hope you will continue to send in unpackaged healthy snacks at break times. Packed lunches are often an area of concern where hidden sugars can lurk! In the examples here, just having two of these sweet treats would take your child over their recommended sugar allowance for the day!
