Marks and Spencer Plastic Recycling Challenge

We are delighted to tell you we are taking part in a Marks and Spencer EPIC Primary Schools Plastic Recycling Challenge (plasticchallenge.net/).

The Challenge teaches children about the benefits of recycling plastic, how all types of plastic can be recycled, and that 'hard to recycle plastics', not currently collected at home, can be brought into school on a collection day to be made into useful items, such as construction hoardings and playground equipment.

As part of the learning activities, the children will watch a clip from the Waste buster website and pledge to recycle paper and plastics. They will ask you at home to do the same and bring your recycling waste into school.

OUR SCHOOL COLLECTION DAY IS ON MONDAY 27th JANUARY 2020. Please bring your bags into the front entrance of the school

Please bring your plastics into school on collection day, in bread bags or plastic carrier bags with tied tops and place them into the large collection bags, for same day collection.

What plastics can you bring?

- Plastic packaging
 - o soft plastic that can be scrunched into a ball i.e. any bags (bread, frozen food, pasta and rice, cereal box liners, carrier bags, etc), cling film, biscuit and sweet wrappers, crisp packets, sachets, pouches
 - o black hard plastic i.e. ready meal and any other trays
- Toys
 - o broken plastic toys
 - o Battery powered toys, but these must be kept separate

PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL ITEMS ARE CLEAN AND DRY.

Bread bags and plastic carrier bags used to bring plastics in for collection will be recycled as part of this scheme.

If our school has the most children participating in our collection, we will win the Challenge and special playground equipment made from our recycled plastics!

We hope you will help us win the Plastic Challenge.




UKS2 Reading Cafe

Our Reading Cafes this term are based on the 'Little People, Big Dreams' series of biographies, and we kicked them off this week with years 5 and 61

To begin with we read a little from Amelia Earhart's story to see how the things that happened when she was young helped her passion for flying to grow and lead her on to do amazing things. Did you know that as well as famously disappearing on her trip to be the first woman to fly round the world, she was also the first woman to fly to 14,000 feet? And the first to



cross the Atlantic? And that she established a women-only pilots club, enabling other women to follow their dreams and learn to fly?



The children then spent some time with their parents thinking about their own passions and dreams, and creating either a 'map of my brain' or a 'mood board' that reflected those things and the possibilities that they represent. We also had one child choose to begin writing her own biography in the style of the 'Little People' books, and sharing them all, we could see how our different memories, passions and interests shape who we are and what we grow up to do.

Finally, we asked the all-important question: What do you want to be when you grow up? With answers varying from 'marine biologist' to 'chef' to 'teacher', it was really interesting to see how the things the children love shaped their dreams for the future.
