







Colour Theory



Secondary Colours: The secondary colours are green, orange and purple. These are created by mixing primary colours Red, blue, yellow) together.

Secondary Colors



Tone: In art, tone refers to the areas of lightness and darkness on an object or colour. How we view tones depends on the surface of the object. Colour tone is created by adding different amounts of white or light colours for light tones.

Shade: Add only black to a hue and you get a shade — which tends to be darker and often more intense than the original colour. Gradually adding different amounts of black, grey or dark colours for darker shades.

Tint: A tint is the opposite of shade- This makes the colour lighter. Gradually adding white to a colour will for you lighter tints.

operates in three dimensions.

Latin 'to cut out, to carve in stone'.

Mixed Media – An artwork in which more than one medium or material has been employed.

Armature – In art, an armature is an underlying, unseen, supporting component (usually of wood or metal) for something else

Contemporary – The term contemporary art is loosely used to refer to the art of the present day and of the relatively recent past, of an innovatory or avant-garde nature.

Mod-roc- A plaster 'impregnated' bandage that can be wrapped around an armature and dries solid.

The sculpture is a 3D branch of art.

Mixed Media combines different elements of art such as painting and sculpture.

Foil can be used to create an **armature** to create a 3D tree.

Mod-roc can be used to create a sculpture.

Mod-roc process is irreversible.

Antony Gormley was born in London in 1950

Antony Gormley is a **contemporary** large scale sculptor.

Antony Gormley created a sculpture called 'Tree waiting for Godot' inspired by writer Samuel Beckett.

Designs need to be planned before they are constructed.

Yumi Okita

Okita is an American textile artists who crates insects (moths and butterflies) using textiles.

Okita's creations, replete with fur, eyes, legs, antennae, and finely-embroidered wing patterns, strike a fine balance between artistry and realism. There's a wonderful tension between the beauty of her work and the unsettling creepy-crawly furriness of a giant bug – her creations can reach up to almost a foot in width.
