Subject	Learning
Music	In music, we will be using Charanga to follow the unit of, 'In the Groove'. We will be: Concentrating on listening and appraising different pieces of music Improvising music Performing our compositions
Design Technololgy	For our DT project this Spring term, we will be desiging and making breakfast frittatas. We will: Examine cookery books Suggest improvements to existing designs Explore how products are created Cut, peel or grate safely and hygienically Cook healthy ingredients Begin to evaluate ideas and products against design criteria In Half term 1, the children will be learning the skills to play tag Rugby and Dodgeball and
PE	 in Half Term 2, the children will be learning the skills to play Netball and for orienteering. Children will know the basic movements including running, jumping, throwing, catching, as well as developing balance, agility and coordination. Children will know they need to apply these basic movements in a range of activities. Children will know simple tactics for attacking and defending. Children will know to participate in team games.
RE	 Our focus this term is Islam. We will be learning: That a mosque is a place of worship for Muslims and the main features of the building. What happens in the mosque and what children do. Why Muhammad is so important to Muslims. Why the Qur'an, is a special book for Muslims, Know some stories about the Prophet Muhammad. About family life for a Muslim child. About the festival of Eid- ul- Fitr marks the end of the month of fasting (Ramadan).

Subject	Learning
PSHE	Our theme for the first half term is Keeping safe. We will learn: What makes them feel safe and what makes them feel unsafe. How to ask for help in an emergency. To recognise familiar situations where they can offer help. Some dangers of road traffic and understand how to stay safe as a pedestrian and a car passenger. About the dangers from the sun and understand how to keep safe. About the dangers of familiar places where water is present and understand how to keep safe. To develop knowledge and skills to stay safe when they are lost. The characteristics of safe places to play. In RSE, we will be learning about Team work and how we can work well in a group. Our theme for the second half term is Economic Wellbeing. We will learn: where money comes from and how it can be used. about the idea of spending and saving their money and begin to understand why it is important to keep belongings, including money, safe. About the different things on offer when they go shopping and how we need to identify the difference between the things we want and the things we need. In RSE, we will be learning about our own and other people's beliefs and how we can repect both similarities and differences between people and ourselves.
