As you probably know – bikes do not fit in these racks - because they are not made to take them.


Could you all park bikes in their rightful place – around by the Pirate ship gate. Thank you

Ofsted Reflections

My training to become a Lead Ofsted Inspector is going well. I am enjoying the new challenge and can already see how the skills I am developing will benefit the school.

Last week I shadowed an Ofsted Inspection. It was a privilege to spend two days in a school, looking closely at what they do and whether it is effective or not. The school I visited expects all children to read at home a minimum of five times a week and to record it in their reading diary. Every reading diary I checked showed evidence of this. Not surprisingly, the children were very good readers. They read a wide range of books and could talk about them in great detail.

I know that when I speak to teachers at Orton Wistow, they often tell me that a high number of children at our school don't read regularly at home at all, so I'm now wondering, 'If children in one school can read five times a week, why can't our children?' I want to explore this further and will talk to staff about how we can raise the profile of reading once again.

Census Day

Please don't forget that this Thursday 17th May is Census Day. We have changed the menu to add the popular choice of **Margarita Pizza along with the original option of a Jumbo Fish Finger.**

This is an important day for us as we have to submit data to the government. This data helps them to decide how much funding we should have next financial year. We are due to be the lowest funded school in Peterborough and so we need to make sure we get as much funding as possible.

For **every** Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2 child having a school meal **on Thursday**, the school receives a year's worth of school meals funding, which is £465 per child. If your child misses the dinner on that day, we don't receive the funding.
